Calf Barn Sanitation Audits

Most years the summer is the "easy" time to raise calves. Air flow in the barns are better and the calves are not usually as stressed as they are during the winter months. Before we dive into another Vermont winter, it might be a good time to take an in depth look at the calf facilities/protocols on your farm to troubleshoot any issues before the weather turns. We are working with a company who is offering a calf barn sanitation audit at no cost to the client to consult with the farm and the veterinarian. This audit encompasses four main areas: water hygiene, feeding and associated equipment, environmental habitat for livestock, and biosecurity (personnel). After data is collected, a report is generated that will help you and your veterinarian address areas of opportunity within your facility. If you are interested in having one of these audits performed on your farm, please let your herd health veterinarian know and they can get you on the schedule.

COVID relief applications

It is hard to keep track of all the grants/funding opportunities revolving around the COVID crisis this year. The federal CFAP program has opened a second round of funding. This will help cover losses that the first round did not cover. You will need to submit your milk production information from April-August, and they will then prorate an estimate to help cover the losses that will occur from September through December. Contact your FSA office for more information, as the deadline for this round is December 11th.

The Vermont assistance program (VCAAP) has temporarily suspended taking new applications for a few weeks while they make some adjustments to the program. Once reopened, the application deadline will be November 15th. This round of funding helps offset losses on milk produced from March through September. The application in online, and questions can be directed to the State Agency of Agriculture.
